The VA budget earmarks about \$18 million dollars per Diem support for traditional facilities (1/100 of 1% of its budget). Knowledgeable sources believe that 300,000 men and woman who served in an American uniform are living on our streets tonight.

Tonight, approximately 1000 veterans will sleep in alleys, abandoned buildings, and under bridges in the State of Maine because they have no home. These men and woman who once served proudly in a military uniform are the nations forgotten heroes. Yet this year alone, over 300,000 of them, all over America (and the numbers may vary), will experience the ravages of homelessness.

A successful local campaign to end and prevent homelessness depends on community partnerships and compassionate citizen involvement. As an individual with or without affiliation, you can make a difference in the lives of America’s former guardians. They answered the call to serve our nation in a way few Americans ever will, and they deserve the full measure of our support in their greatest hour of need.
